

## Sewn-bag type C button shroud


Material must be biodegradable — cotton, silk, hemp, bamboo, etc. — and have a dense thread-count. **Note:** backboards (as in package and Muslim-types shrouds) and/or handles (as in type B wrapped and D ribbons shrouds) can be added to this type with, or instead of, straps to facilitate lowering the body into the grave.






CINDEA (Canadian Integrative Network for Death Education and Alternatives) — designs for shrouds 2012 Sewn-bag type C button, optional



- a) Cut 3 pieces of 15 feet long strips of canvas (or other heavy material, like denim) hem if you choose to; these become the straps
- b) Fold the straps in half (to find the centre)
- c) Make sure to match the centre of each strap with the centre-line of the back pieces of the shroud
- d) Sew double lines of stitching, being careful to only stitch to 3 inches from the outside edge
- e) Fold or pin the loose ends of the straps over the stitching to avoid them getting caught in further stitching


## Sewn-bag type C button, step 2

- a) place right/good sides of back and left-side panel together, and sew the outer edge
- b) turn the straight side of the left-side panel over (at least 2 inches — this is where the buttons will be sewn) and top-stitch from top to bottom (sides for buttons and buttonholes can be changed for men)



## and step 3

- c) turn the straight side of the right-side panel over (at least 2 inches — this is where the buttonholes will be sewn), and topstitch panel edge from top to bottom d) place right-hand
  - sides of back and right-side panel together, and sew the outer edge
  - e) sew top and bottom of shroud
  - f) turn shroud right side out
