#### **Burial Shrouds**

CINDEA has designed 6 different kinds of burial shrouds — two unsewn and 4 sewn. The patterns for making the shrouds are on the website at <a href="http://www.cindea.ca/home-funerals.html#designs">http://www.cindea.ca/home-funerals.html#designs</a> (which links to a separate page just on designs for shrouds) — the patterns have both written and graphic instructions. The designs have been approved for use at Royal Oak Burial Park's 'Woodlands' (Canada's first green burial ground — see <a href="http://www.robp.ca/">http://www.robp.ca/</a>). Ecologically-minded traditional burial grounds and crematoriums may also allow the use of shrouds, as an option to coffins.
